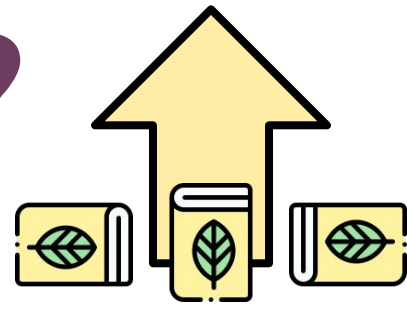
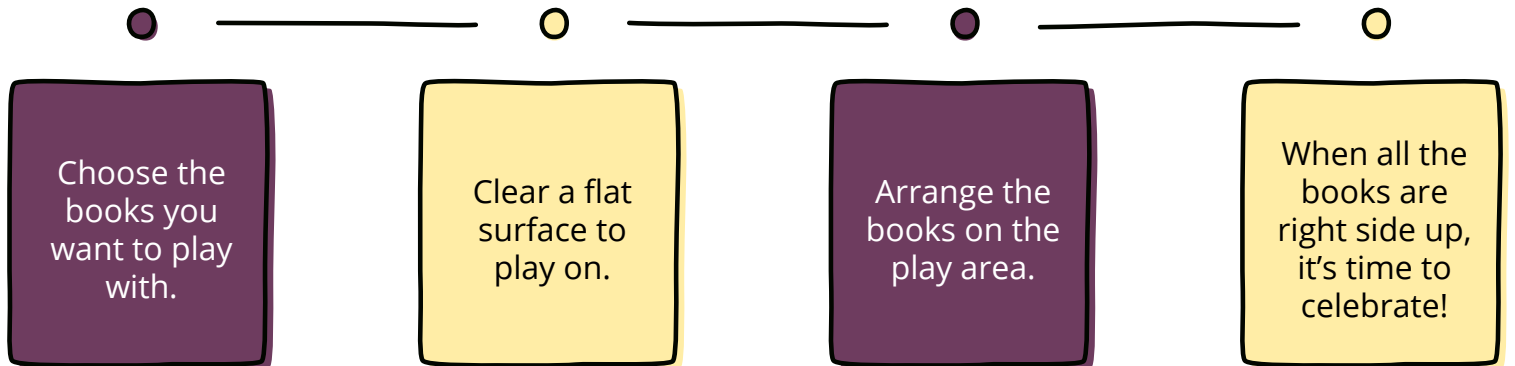
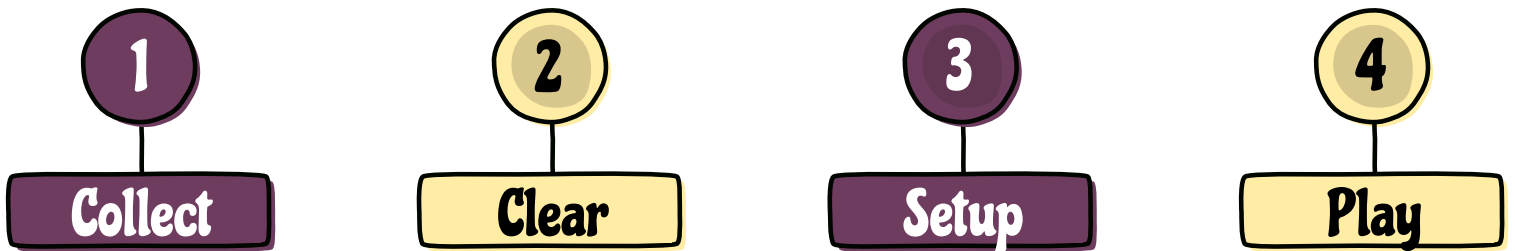


# Which Way Is Up?



## How to Play



↓  
**Tips**

3 books is a good starting point.  
Board books can be easier for little hands to manipulate.

**Tips**

Tables are the obvious choice, but a clear spot on the floor, or your little one's bed, will work just fine.

**Tips**

Position the books upside down, backwards, tented open on the table — any way that isn't the right way up.  
Feel free to get creative and have fun with this step!

**Tips**

Depending on your child's age and experience, you may need to work through the books one at a time, asking them variations on the basic question "Which way is up?"  
Alternate wordings I like to play with are:  
Does it go like this?  
Is this the right way?  
How about this way?

## Additional Tips

Allowing your little one to reposition the book themselves helps develop their fine motor skills, but if they're struggling to the point of frustration, feel free to turn the book for them. Repeat variations on the basic question with each turn, until they confirm it's the right way up. Have fun celebrating each time they win!

If your kiddo turns the book the wrong way, try using questions like "Are you sure?", "Do you think so?" and "What about this way?" to encourage them to try a different position. Offer lots of validation when they finally turn it right side up!
